

## GEORGE JACKSON - Conductor

George Jackson has quickly made a name for the breadth and commitment of his work, whether in opera, symphonic repertoire or contemporary scores, building strong relationships with the orchestras he conducts. Starting from September 2022 he is Music Director of the Amarillo Symphony.

He is increasingly sought-after as a guest with European orchestras, who appreciate his fearless conducting and thorough rehearsal technique. Recent engagements include BBC Symphony Orchestra, Orchestre de Paris, RTÉ National Symphony Orchestra, Birmingham Contemporary Music Group, Orchestre National Montpellier Occitanie, Orchestra of Opéra de Rouen. He ha salso worked with London Philharmonic, London Symphony Orchestra, Philharmonia Orchestra, Nordwestdeutsche Philharmonie, Orchestre Régional de Normandie, West Bohemian Symphony, Baltic Philharmonic, Vienna Chamber Orchestra, London Firebird Orchestra, Winston-Salem Symphony, Orchestra Haydn di Bolzano, Orchestra del Teatro Carlo Felice di Genova, Les Arts Florissants. His skill in preparing complex scores has led to an ongoing relationship with Ensemble Intercontemporain.

Praised for his natural affinity for opera, he has received acclaim for his work in productions of Hänsel und Gretel, Janáček's The Excursions of Mr Brouček and the world premiere of Philips' Gods of the Games (Grange Park Opera), Le nozze di Figaro and La bohème (Opera Holland Park), Il barbiere di Siviglia (Theater an der Wien), Die Zauberflöte (Opera North Nottingham), Pagliacci and L'impresario delle Canarie (Frankfurt). Other highlights of his career include his outstanding debut at Vienna Musikverein with the ORF Radio Symphony Orchestra in June 2013, conducting the Austrian premiere of Michael Jarrell's 'Ombres', his debut in Madrid with A campo abierto at Operadhoy; in 2017 Immer weiter! by Irene Galindo Quero and Jesse Broekman at Staatsoper Hamburg.

Born in London, George Jackson read for a degree in music at Trinity College, Dublin. He subsequently studied conducting at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna and he received additional training at Weimar's Franz Liszt Hochschule für Musik. He continued his studies at the Lucerne Festival Academy, the Bayreuth Festival and, over two summers, at the Aspen Conducting Academy, where he won the 2015 Aspen Conducting Prize.
